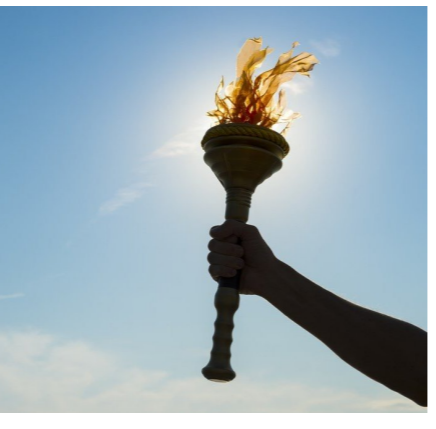

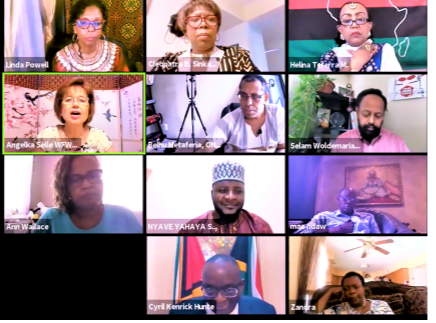


## Reflections on the first Global One Million Rally for Hope: Looking in the Mirror!

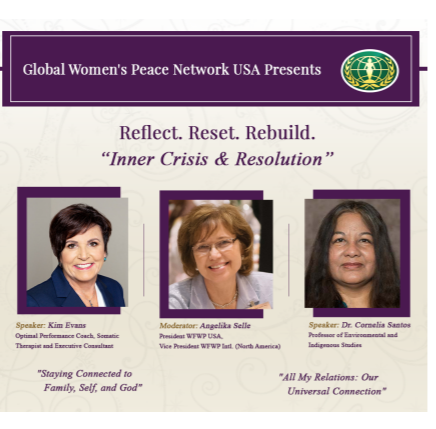


## Educational resources for parents and teachers: Learning from home
