Updates from the Foster Parent Project in Cambodia

The Clifton, New Jersey chapter of WFWP, spearheaded by Chairwoman Hiroko Nitro, has been actively supporting the Foster Parent Project in Cambodia, in partnership with WFWP Japan, since 2015. With the help of foster parents in New Jersey, children in impoverished rural areas of the Southeast Asian country receive ongoing financial and emotional assistance that enables them to obtain quality education. Each foster parent is updated regularly on the development of the children they are sponsoring.

This year has been especially challenging, with normal schooling disrupted as a result of the pandemic. Yuka Takahashi was able to visit the children in November and shared a report of her experiences.

Since large meetings became restricted due to COVID-19 in the spring, only Mrs. Nary, who is organizing this program, visited the children in spring and distributed the support money. Afterwards, I visited our foster children with souvenirs packed with stationery and toothpaste sets on November 8, 2020. I haven't seen them for a year, and it was a wonderful gathering to see all our precious children...

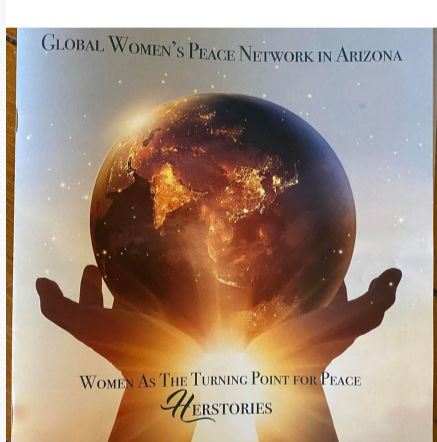


Reflections on a COVID year: When inner turmoil mirrors the outside
