THE ORIGIN OF MOTHER'S DAY

Although you might think that Mother's Day was initiated by Hallmark, it was not motivated by commercialism but instead inspired by women's peace groups. In 1868, Ann Jarvis (pictured left) created a committee to establish a "Mother's Friendship Day." The purpose was to reunite families that had been divided during the American Civil War. When the Civil War broke out, Ann Jarvis called together women to pledge that friendship and good will would not be a casualty of the war.

In a remarkable display of courage and compassion, the women nursed soldiers from both sides and saved many lives from both sides. Ann - who had previously organized "Mother's Day Work Clubs" to improve sanitation and health for both Union and Confederate encampments undergoing a typhoid outbreak - wanted to expand this into an annual memorial for mothers, but she died in 1905 before the celebration became popular...
