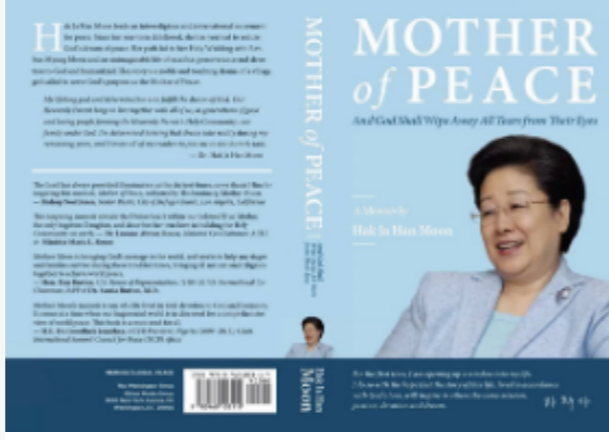
[#GivingforGood Launches in America](#)

Thanks to our generous donors all around the country, Women's Federation for World Peace USA was recently able to send a donation of \$10,000 to the Handow Secondary School in Lugari, Kenya. This educational institution is one of ten schools in Africa that WFP has been supporting annually as part of the Schools of Africa project.

Founded in 1998, Handow Secondary School is located in an impoverished rural area far from the capital Nairobi. The local population depends mainly on crop farming and livestock, and access to quality education is very limited. Despite all the challenges, including a lack of electricity and running water, with the help of WFP, Handow school has been able to grow and develop, graduating more than 2100 students, and it continues to make a lasting impact on the students, teachers, staff, their families and the community at large...
