I was born during the war in Afghanistan and unlike many people, my

childhood wasn't so peaceful. When the Taliban seized Afghanistan in 1996, they barred women from all public institutions including schools, workplaces, and universities. Women were forced to wear a Burqa – a misogynistic piece of clothing meant to conceal the identities of women. At that time, my parents decided to leave Afghanistan in hopes for a better future for my siblings and I. We left Afghanistan in 1996 and fled to Pakistan, where we stayed for three years, before ending up in Denmark. I have spent most of my life in Denmark. I finished school and attended university there, and I am currently studying towards a graduate degree in international relations and conflict resolution at the University of Copenhagen...


