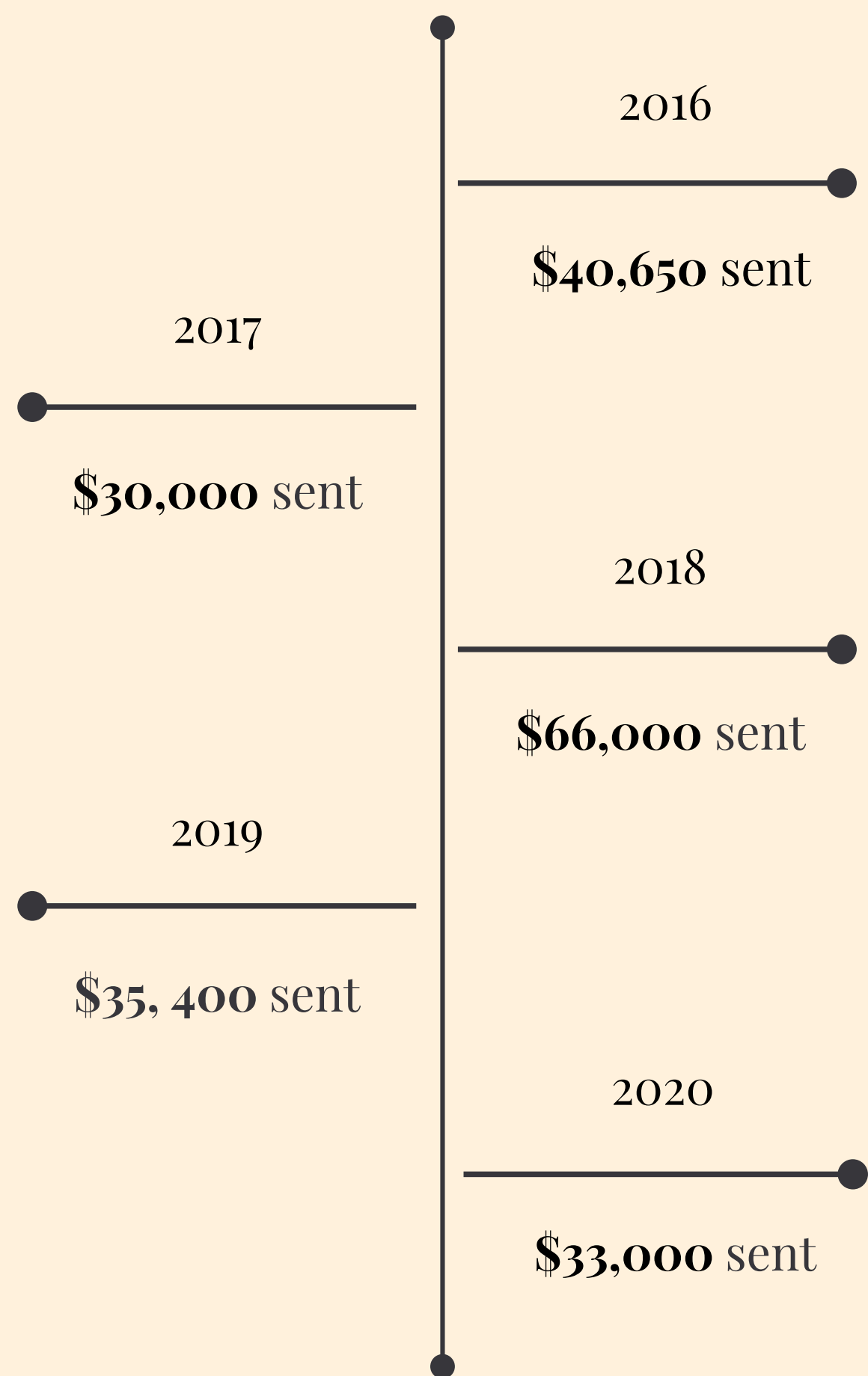

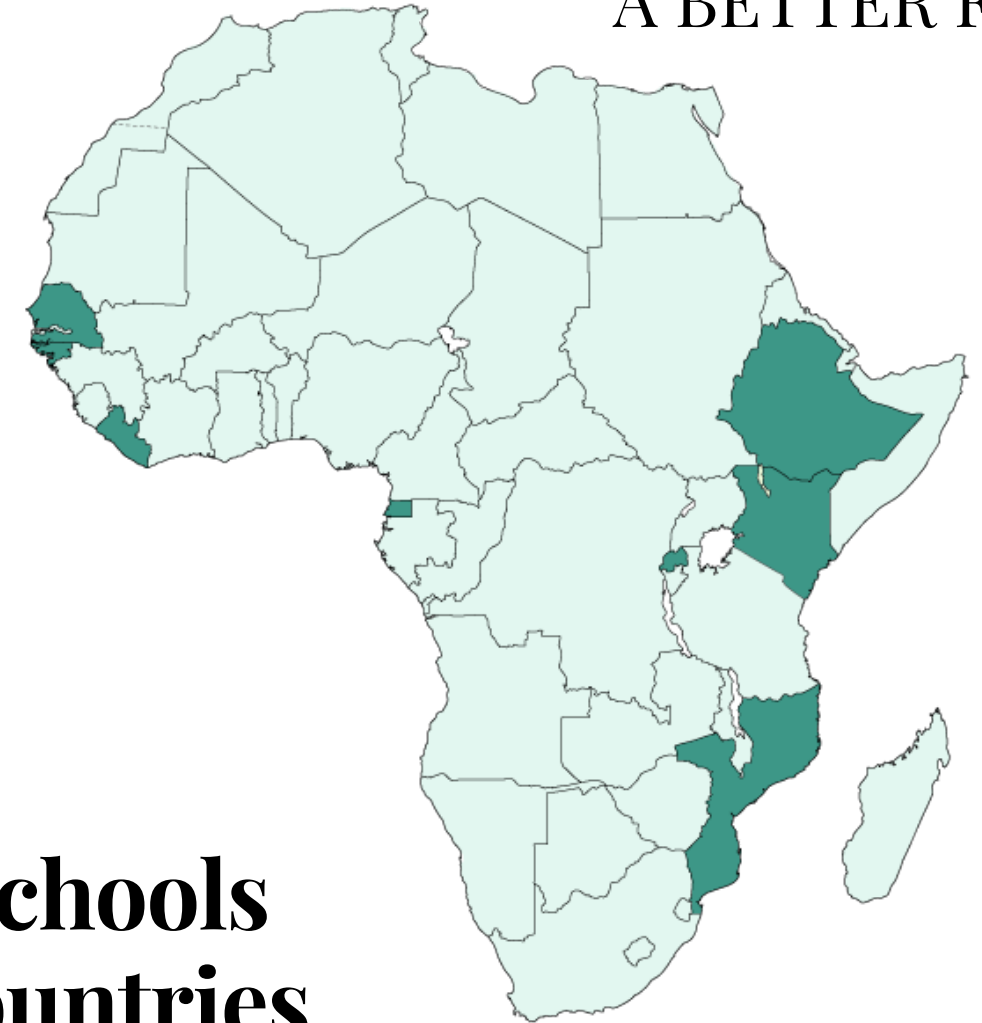

The Peace Hana School in Liberia received a \$15,000 grant from WFP USA at the end of 2019.

This helped pay for the rent of the building for two years. They also built a new fence, bought 50 new chairs and desks, repaired the school partially, and prepared some pieces of equipment for the school reopening. The rest of was used for teachers' salaries.



Thanks to the support of 2016, the Sun of Mozambique High School was able to **make the changes necessary to foster a supportive learning environment** through various school improvements. As a result, 2017 – 2018 marked an excellent year for academic achievement among the students.

# The Jordan Arabic Literacy Project

WFWP USA

IN 2018

WFWP Jordan is running literacy classes at the WFWP and Community Development Centers (CDC) located in the refugee camps. **Especially in 2020, the center has been able to stay open because public schools have been closed for over a year due to the pandemic.** The WFWP center is one of the few places where they can study in the area.



2018

- \$7,000 sent to refugee children to support their education.

2019

- New location is found for second location of WFWP Center.

Volunteer for Jordan Arabic Literacy Project



WFWP USA ran a fundraising campaign to support the Arabic Literacy Project in 2020. With your support, Mrs. Irikura is able to **renovate the centers, replace old plastic chairs and tables with new ones, purchase new school materials, and provide stipends to the dedicated tutors.** The goal was to raise \$4,000 and the final result was \$5,397!



Due to finances in 2016, the WFWP tutoring center closed. Not wanting to stop activities, active core women started searching for a small space with a reasonable rent where they could open a WFWP center themselves. **They nearly gave up.** It took almost three years after the old one had closed to find a new location in 2019.

“**The reason for their persistence was that they had learned through WFWP activities what is the most important thing in our lives, which is to live for others. Therefore, they could not abandon it.**”

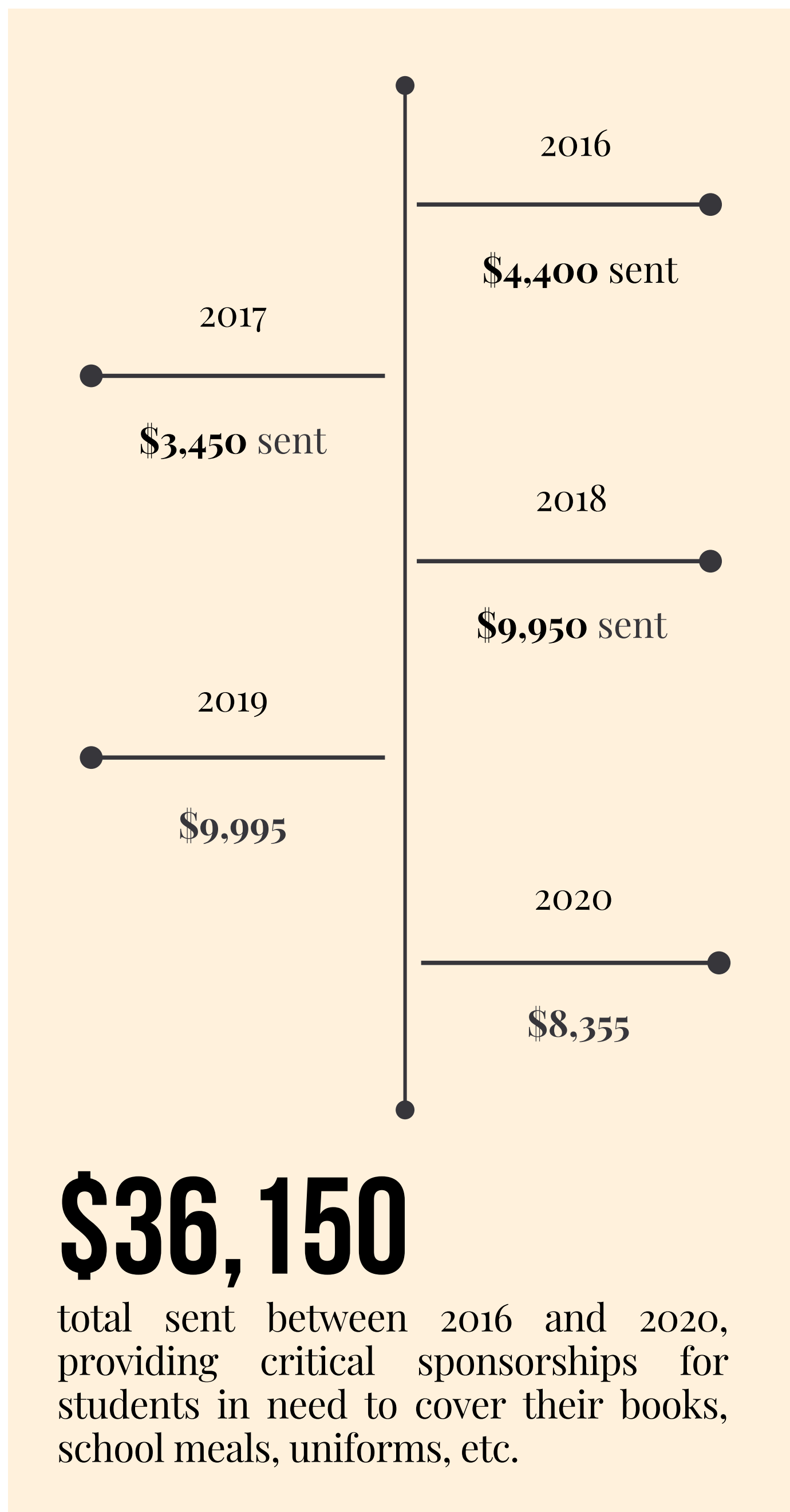

# Cambodia Foster Care Project

WFWP NEW JERSEY BEGAN SUPPORTING THIS PROJECT IN 2015



“Children in orphanages or other places that often receive foreign volunteers are used to strangers and they easily welcome them with cheerful smiles. In contrast, our foster children are not used to such visits and usually don’t smile the first time we meet them. For some children, even the second visit, they’re still hesitant. However, after a few opportunities to interact, **I have noticed that they started to show their smiles. And their smiles are so lovely!** We hope these children can continue studying as much as possible and thus open the way for a bright future.”

# DEEP LOVE FOR CAMBODIA



WFWP New Jersey's contact in Cambodia visited the children receiving sponsorships in 2018, 2020, and 2021 to meet with them and see how their studies are going to send updates to their foster parents in the United States. Through the sponsorship, students are given the opportunity to continue their education, providing for various school fees and educational costs.



**2020 has been especially challenging**, with schooling disrupted as a result of the pandemic. WFWP New Jersey is currently supporting Wat Ang Middle School in Kiri Vong, in the Takeo province in southern Cambodia. It reopened in September 2020, and most children stayed in the same grade for the new school year.

# Other Overseas Giving

## EQUADOR EARTHQUAKE RELIEF



In 2016, WFWP USA donated **\$968** to support the victims and families of Ecuador that were survivors of the 2016 earthquakes.

## PHILIPPINES TYPHOON RELIEF

In 2020, WFWP Arizona and USA collected \$2,500 in donations for the victims and families of the most recent typhoon hitting the Philippines.

## HAITI MEDICAL MISSION

Between 2019 – 2020, WFWP USA gave \$8,100 to support WFWP Global Friend Stand Up To Poverty's project in Haiti. Over the course of a week, a team of more than 100 medical professionals and volunteers served 850 Haitian people with a variety of needs.
